## LUZERNE COUNTY CHNA REPORT

Lehigh Valley Health Network (LVHN) is pleased to present our 2022 Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) Health Profiles. This report includes data and information about Luzerne County and defines "community" as all residents living within the county. Within the communities LVHN serves, the CHNA reports place a greater emphasis on individuals who are experiencing health disparities or who are at risk for negative health outcomes as a result of social and environmental factors influencing their health.

The CHNA Health Profile examines factors that impact the health and wellness of the community. This includes social and environmental factors such as employment, education and air quality; individual behaviors like smoking or healthy eating; and the quality and availability of health care in the area. It includes secondary data from publicly available state and local sources such as the Centers for Disease Control and the Census Bureau. This data is used to identify the top health and social needs in our community and is then validated through community meetings and interviews with residents (primary data). When taken together, this serves as an important overview of the current state of health in our region and identifies potential areas of concern that Lehigh Valley Health Network can work to address.

The 2022 LVHN CHNA Health Profile is broken out into a number of subsections, including Demographics, Social and Economic Factors, Health Behaviors, and Health Outcomes. In addition, two types of callout boxes are incorporated throughout the report. The first summarizes data presented on that page, providing easy-to-read summary statements. The second highlights findings from the community meetings and interviews.

Information in this Health Profile will be used to develop a three-year Implementation Plan, which outlines LVHN's plan to address the needs identified. The 2022 Implementation Plan will be shared soon after the Health Profiles are released.

## SUMMARY OF DATA FOR LUZERNE COUNTY

- Luzerne County is ranked among the least healthy counties in Pennsylvania (lowest 0\%-25\%) in terms of health outcomes and health factors.
- The social vulnerability index is a measure of the degree of social vulnerability in counties and neighborhoods across the United States, where a higher score indicates higher vulnerability. Luzerne County has a social vulnerability index score of 0.61 , which is greater than the state average of 0.41 .


## DEMOGRAPHICS

- Total population in Luzerne County is 317,663 and 24,857 in Hazleton. About $20 \%$ of the population is age 65 or older in the county, but only $14 \%$ in Hazleton. In Hazleton, about 19\% of the popultion are between ages 5 and 17.
- The population in the county is primarily white ( $82 \%$ ), followed by Hispanic ( $12 \%$ ) and Black ( $4 \%$ ). In Hazleton, $60 \%$ of the population is Hispanic and $38 \%$ is white.
- Within Luzerne County, about $20 \%$ of the population is under 18, which increases to $26 \%$ in Hazleton. Of those 62,555 under 18 , there are 13,858 Hispanics under age 18 , representing $22 \%$ of the total population under age 18. In Hazleton, there are 5,300 Hispanic youth under age 18 , which is $82.5 \%$ of all youth under age 18 in Hazleton, significantly greater than the $12 \%$ of youth in the state.
- $16 \%$ of the population has a disability in Luzerne County, and $36 \%$ of those age 65 and older have a disability.
- 5\% of the population in the county has limited English proficiency, similar to the percentage across the whole state, but in Hazleton the percent of the population with limited English proficiency increases to $28 \%$. Within that 5\%, 85\% speak Spanish at home, $9 \%$ Indo-European languages, and 5\% Asian and Pacific Island languages.
- $9 \%$ of the population in Luzerne are veterans, primarily male, and $60 \%$ of whom are age 65 and older. In Hazleton, $5.5 \%$ of the total population are veterans.


## SOCIAL AND ECONOMIC FACTORS

- Of the 262,545 working age population in Luzerne County, 161,143 are included in the labor force. The labor force participation rate is $61.4 \%$, in line with Pennsylvania and the U.S.
- The unemployment rate in Luzerne trended down between 2010 and 2019, decreasing from $9.7 \%$ to $5.8 \%$,and then increased to $10.9 \%$ in 2020. By May 2021 the unemployment rate was declining again and was $7.4 \%$.
- The median household income (MHI) in the county is $\$ 53,473$, which is lower than the state MHI of $\$ 61,744$. The MHI is even lower in Hazleton at $\$ 44,408$. The MHI in Luzerne is greatest for Asian households followed by non-Hispanic white households.
- $26 \%$ of the children living in Luzerne County are living in poverty, which increases to $35 \%$ in Hazleton. $46 \%$ of the Hispanic or Latino children living in Luzerne are living in poverty, whereas $20 \%$ of the non-Hispanic or Latino children are living in poverty.
- $15 \%$ of the population in the county is living in poverty, which is greater than the state $(12.4 \%) .22 \%$ of the population in Hazleton is living in poverty.
- $39 \%$ of the population age 3-4 are enrolled in preschool, below the state and U.S. percentages.
- The graduation rate from high school in the county is $86 \%$. $90 \%$ of the non-Hispanic white population graduate from high school compared to $83 \%$ of the Black or African American population, and $74 \%$ of the Hispanic population.
- $10 \%$ of the population does not have a high school degree. Broken down by race and ethnicity, $33 \%$ of the Hispanic or Latino population in Luzerne does not have a high school diploma, compared to $8 \%$ of the non-Hispanic or Latino population.
- There are a total of 128,660 households in Luzerne County, $63 \%$ of which are family households. $13.5 \%$ of all households are single-female family households.
- Evictions in Luzerne County increased from 2.8\% in 2007 to $5.2 \%$ in 2015, but decreased to 3\% in 2016.
- Of the 128,660 total households in Luzerne County, 33,131 or $26 \%$ of the population live in cost-burdened households, which increases to $34 \%$ in Hazleton. Among the costburdened households in the county, $39 \%$ are rental households, $23 \%$ are owner-occupied households with mortgages, and $16 \%$ are owner-occupied households without a mortgage. Those who are renting are more likely to be cost burdened than those who are owners.
- $11.5 \%$ of the population in Hazleton is uninsured, and $5 \%$ of the population in the county is uninsured, which is on par with the percentage in the state.
- $19 \%$ of the population in the county is receiving SNAP benefits, which has been increasing in the county since 2007 when $10.5 \%$ of the population was receiving SNAP benefits.


## HEALTH BEHAVIORS

- The teen birth rate is 22.6 per 1,000 females age 15-19 in Luzerne County. The teen birth rate is 15.6 per 1,000 female population age 15-19 for non-Hispanic white teenagers, 33.3 per 1,000 for non-Hispanic Black teenagers, and 49.3 among Hispanic or Latino teenagers.
- The annual violent crime rate in Luzerne County is 265.2 per 100,000 people, which is lower than the state rate of 309.4 per 100,000 people.
- In Luzerne County, $22 \%$ of adults self-report excessive drinking in the last 30 days, which is greater than the state rate of $20.2 \%$.
- Within Luzerne County, 70,023 or $27.4 \%$ of adults age 20 and older self-report no active leisure time, based on the question: "During the past month, other than your regular job, did you participate in any physical activities or exercises such as running, calisthenics, golf, gardening, or walking for exercise?"
- 20.2\% of adults in Luzerne are current smokers.


## HEALTH OUTCOMES

- Within Luzerne County, there is a cancer incidence rate of 509 for every 100,000 total in the population, and the incidence rate is highest among the white population followed by the incidence rate in the Black population and Hispanic or Latino population. About 167 people per 100,000 in the county die from cancer, which is slightly above the state rate of 160.5 per 100,000.
- In Luzerne, 10\% of adults age 20 and older have diabetes.
- The percent of Medicare patients with heart disease is $35 \%$, which is higher than the state percent of $27 \%$, and has been consistently decreasing since 2011 in Luzerne County. 63\% of the Medicare population has high blood pressure.
- $8.1 \%$ of infants born in Luzerne County are born with low birth weight, compared to $12 \%$ in Pennsylvania. This percentage is $7.6 \%$ among infants who are white, $11.5 \%$ among infants who are Black, and $8.4 \%$ among infants who are Hispanic.
- A total of 117 people per 100,000 people in the county die from coronary heart disease, which is greater than the state rate of 96 per 100,000 people. A greater number of males (152.7 per 100,000) die from coronary heart disease than females ( 90.6 per 100,000).
- Within Luzerne County, there were a total of 316 deaths due to suicide between 2015 and 2019. This represents an age-adjusted death rate of 19.4 per every 100,000 total population, which is higher than the state rate of 14.5 . The rate is higher among males (29.9 per 100,000) than females ( 9.4 per 100,000).
- Unintentional injury rates and motor vehicles deaths are higher among males than females in Luzerne County.
- $33 \%$ of the adult population is obese, and this percentage has been increasing in Luzerne County since 2004 ( $25 \%$ ).
- Within Luzerne County, 20\% of persons age 18 and older self-report having poor or fair health, which is greater than the state rate of $17.7 \%$.



## HEALTH INDICES

## AREA DEPRIVATION INDEX

This indicator reports the average (population weighted) area deprivation index (ADI) for the selected area. The ADI is a metric used to rank neighborhoods by socioeconomic status disadvantage in a region of interest (e.g., at the state or national level). ADI scores range from 1 to 100 , with 1 representing the least disadvantaged areas.

## SOCIAL VULNERABILITY INDEX

The degree to which a community exhibits certain social conditions, including high poverty, low percentage of vehicle access, or crowded households, may affect that community's ability to prevent human suffering and financial loss in the event of disaster. These factors describe a community's social vulnerability.

## TOTAL POPULATION

A total of 317,663 people live in the 890.35 -square-mile report area defined for this assessment according to the U.S. Census Bureau American Community Survey 2015-19 five-
year estimates. The population density for this area, estimated at 356.79 persons per square mile, is greater than the national average population density of 91.93 persons per square mile.

There is a growing and vibrant Hispanic population within Hazleton. Community members and leaders who participated in community conversations highlighted that there is a lack of capable translators in the community, and often translations on signs are not a correct reflection of the Spanish language. Community members acknowledge a correlation between English as a second language and job attainability, leading to low-pay jobs and no benefits.

As it relates to health care, the lack of bilingual providers or translators who understand medical terminology well can result in a breakdown of communication. Patients feel they do not understand their medical information they are told or how to properly address instructions they are given. Community members suggested incentivizing bilingual students to pursue careers in health care in order to increase the availability of bilingual providers.

There is a lack of accessible transportation, and rental prices are increasing. The compounding nature of these barriers makes it difficult to prioritize family well-being and individual health.

## ATTAINMENT - HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION RATE

The adjusted cohort graduation rate (ACGR) is a graduation metric that follows a "cohort" of first-time ninth graders in a particular school year, and adjusts this number by adding any students who transfer into the cohort after ninth grade and subtracting any students who transfer out, emigrate to another country, or pass away. The ACGR is the percentage of the students in this cohort who graduate within four years. In the report area, the adjusted cohort graduation rate was $85.7 \%$ during the most recently reported school year. Students in the report area performed worse than the state, which had an ACGR of $88.3 \%$.

## EVICTIONS

This indicator reports information about formal evictions based on court records from 48 states and the District of Columbia, compiled by the Eviction Lab. The number of evictions and eviction filings within the report area is shown below. The "filing rate" is the ratio of the number of evictions filed in an area over the number of renter-occupied homes in that area. An "eviction rate" is the subset of those homes that received an eviction judgment in which renters were ordered to leave. For the year 2016, the Eviction Lab reports that, of 45,014 homes in the report area, there were 1,636 eviction filings, for an eviction filing rate of $3.63 \% .1,057$ of the eviction filings ended in an eviction, for an eviction rate of $2.35 \%$.

Community members reported that rent rates in Hazleton and the surrounding areas have become unaffordable and there are not enough rental options, leading to inflated rents, overcrowding, and poorly maintained properties. They also identified that there are no family shelters available in the area, and shelters in general have been difficult to access or get into due to COVID-19.

## HOUSING QUALITY - SUBSTANDARD HOUSING

Community members and leaders in Hazleton acknowledge a general lack of emphasis on preventive services. Those who lack health insurance and are living in low-income households are not able to prioritize preventive health services. There is also a lack of education and awareness about the importance and value of health care and wellness prior to being sick. In addition, one group mentioned that there seems to be a lot of preventive services available to those 65 and older, but are very limited before the age of 65 . Immunizations for children is another area where a focus on prevention would be helpful to ensuring all students in school are immunized.

## CLINICAL CARE AND PREVENTION

A lack of access to care presents barriers to good health. Supply of facilities and physicians, the rate of uninsurance, financial hardship, transportation barriers, cultural competency, and coverage limitations affect access.

Rates of morbidity, mortality, and emergency hospitalizations can be reduced if community residents access services such as health screenings, routine tests, and vaccinations. Prevention indicators can call attention to a lack of access or knowledge regarding one or more health issues and can inform program interventions.

## CANCER SCREENING - MAMMOGRAM (MEDICARE)

This indicator reports the percentage of female Medicare beneficiaries age 35 and older who had a mammogram in most recent reporting year. The American Cancer Society recommends that women age 45 to 54 should get a mammogram every year, and women age 55 and older should get a mammogram every other year. In the latest reporting period there were 48,805 Medicare beneficiaries in the report area, and $32 \%$ of female beneficiaries age 35 or older had a mammogram in the past year. The rate in the report area was lower than the state rate of $34 \%$ during the same time period.

## DIABETES MANAGEMENT - HEMOGLOBIN A1c TEST

Mental health concerns and increasing use of drugs and alcohol were consistently mentioned by community members and leaders as one of the most pressing health issues in Hazleton and Luzerne County. Participants in community conversations reported a lack of accessible resources and a wait list to get into the services that are available. As a result, people who need treatment are not able to get it.

These were important issues in the community prior to the COVID-19 pandemic, but community members acknowledged that the issues have gotten worse with the pandemic. Social isolation is leading to increases in depression and substance abuse. Community members feel there have been more DUIs, overdoses, and domestic violence since the pandemic began. Mental health and substance abuse issues are impacting the entire community, and there needs to be a community-wide effort to address these important health concerns.

27.4\% of adults in Luzerne County self-report no active leisure time.

## HEALTH BEHAVIORS

Health behaviors such as poor diet, a lack of exercise, and substance abuse contribute to poor health status.

## ALCOHOL - HEAVY ALCOHOL CONSUMPTION

In the report area, 70,957 or $22.34 \%$ of adults self-report excessive drinking in the last 30 days, which is greater than the state rate of $20.20 \%$. ## COVID-19 - Confirmed Cases

This indicator reports incidence rate of confirmed COVID-19 cases per 100,000 population. Data for this indicator are updated daily and derived from the Johns Hopkins University data feed.

In the report area, there have been 6,408 total confirmed cases of COVID-19. The rate of confirmed cases is 10,130.77 per 100,000 population, which is greater than the state average of $9,521.35$. Data are current as of 07/14/2021.
