## HOW A NOT-FOR-PROFIT ORGANIZATION DETERMINES COMMUNITY BENEFIT

The not-for-profit entities of Lehigh Valley Health Network qualify as charitable organizations under Pennsylvania Act 55.

The Act sets specific criteria for what constitutes a charitable organization, defines the uncompensated goods and services that qualify as community benefit, and prescribes how these goods and services are measured.

PHYSICIAN RECRUITMENT Includes subsidized costs to recruit physicians to provide care in numerous medically underserved areas.	446,174

PROFESSIONAL AND PATIENT EDUCATION AND RESEARCH	\$45,155,464
MEDICAL EDUCATION*	29,831,222
Includes salaries and benefits for medical residents, the cost net of tuition for the SELECT medical school program, a portion of salaries and benefits for program directors and others who support graduate and undergraduate medical education, and support activities such as the hospital library.	
NURSING EDUCATION*	12,336,611
Includes salaries and benefits for nurses who attend the Critical Care Internship. Also includes salaries and benefits for personnel providing education.	
RESEARCH ACTIVITIES	2,568,428
Includes research in areas such as neurology, oncology and family medicine that are not grant funded.	
HEALTH PROFESSIONAL AND STUDENT EDUCATION	419,203
Includes education provided at Lehigh Valley Hospital–Hazleton, Lehigh Valley Hospital–Schuylkill and Lehigh Valley Hospital–Pocono.

between the full cost of education and research programs, and payments received to support these programs.	
COMMUNITY EDUCATION AND PREVENTION	\$11,496,576
LEHIGH VALLEY TOPPER CANCER INSTITUTE Includes nurse navigators, support groups, classes, programs and nutrition counseling. This amount reflects the cost of providing these services free of charge.	1,845,976
PASTORAL CARE Provides ministry to patients, family and staff. Includes a portion of salaries and benefits for pastoral care staff.	947,626
HEALTH PROMOTION AND DISEASE PREVENTION Includes fitness programs, health fairs, patient education publications and other publications promoting wellness and disease awareness, staffing costs for free COVID-19 vaccine clinics and public health messaging surrounding COVID-19.	7,715,437
DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY HEALTH Includes COVID-19 vaccination efforts, Community Health Needs Assessment, FORESIGHT, Engagement Network, partnership with the Kellyn Foundation, Cardiac Heart Failure Food Prescription Pilot with Meals on Wheels of the Lehigh Valley and other programs designed to improve the health and well-being of vulnerable community members.	178,667
EMERGENCY EDUCATION Includes training and education for physicians, nurses and first-responders region wide. We also provide free bioterrorism and disaster preparedness training in our community.	808,870



COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS AND SUPPORT	\$20,700,928
EQUIVALENT VALUE OF SUPPORT FOR AGENCIES AND MUNICIPALITIES Includes free physical exams for municipal workers and financial support for municipalities, disease prevention programs, services and exams at local schools, and support for Valley Health Partners Community Health Center. Also includes real estate taxes paid by the health network on owned and leased property.	9,029,515
EQUIVALENT VALUE OF VOLUNTEER ASSISTANCE* Includes 108,443 hours donated by volunteers.	3,165,437
INTERPRETING SERVICE Includes hospital-based language interpreting services, purchased foreign language and sign language interpreting services provided free of charge.	3,952,837
PATIENT CARE COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES Includes free flu shots, free medications for people unable to pay, the cost of Medical Assistance enrollment services provided free of charge, and the difference between payments for mental health services from Lehigh County and the cost of providing services at two residential aftercare programs.	3,674,277
SPONSORSHIPS FOR COMMUNITY SERVICE ORGANIZATIONS Includes support for numerous not-for-profit organizations that are aligned with our health network's mission, along with support of the Burn Prevention Network.	878,862
*About volunteers and Act 55: As per Act 55, it is appropriate for charitable organizations to report volunteer service. This shows how valuable volunteers are to the institution and the community. Act 55 provides a formula for calculating this based on the Pennsylvania Workers Compensation Act. We follow that formula.
