HOW A NOT-FOR-PROFIT ORGANIZATION DETERMINES COMMUNITY BENEFIT

The not-for-profit entities of Lehigh Valley Health Network qualify as charitable organizations under Pennsylvania Act 55. The Act sets specific criteria for what constitutes a charitable organization, defines the uncompensated goods and services that qualify as community benefit, and prescribes how these goods and services are measured.

Includes difference between clinic payments and costs for primary and specialty clinics and related services.	
SUBSIDIZED HEALTH SERVICES	6,711,116
The difference between payments and costs for subsidized health services provided at Lehigh Valley Hospital–Ha- zleton and Lehigh Valley Hospital–Schuylkill.	
TRICARE SHORTFALL*	879,402
TRICARE is a federally funded health plan for military personnel, retirees and their families.

Includes research in areas such as neurology, oncology and family medicine that are not grant funded.	
HEALTH PROFESSIONAL AND STUDENT EDUCATION	331,888
Includes education provided at Lehigh Valley Hospital–Hazleton, Lehigh Valley Hospital–Schuylkill and	,
Lehigh Valley Hospital-Pocono.

COMMUNITY EDUCATION AND PREVENTION	\$5,788,567
LEHIGH VALLEY HEALTH NETWORK CANCER CENTER	1,531,771
Includes nurse navigators, support groups, classes, programs and nutrition counseling. This amount reflects the cost of providing these services free of charge.	
PASTORAL CARE	868,578
Provides ministry to patients, family and staff. Includes a portion of salaries and benefits for pastoral care staff.	
HEALTH PROMOTION AND DISEASE PREVENTION	2,571,827
Includes Healthy You magazine, fitness programs, health fairs, patient education publications and other publications promoting wellness and disease awareness.	
DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY HEALTH	379,617
Includes community-based initiatives through grant acquisition and program management, Community Health	
Needs Assessment, Health Advocacy Program, Veterans Health Program, Street Medicine, Allentown Children's Health Improvement Project (ACHIP), and other programs designed to integrate care and promote health.	
EMERGENCY EDUCATION	436,774
Includes training and education for physicians, nurses and first-responders region-wide. We also provide free bioterrorism and disaster preparedness training in our community.

EQUIVALENT VALUE OF SUPPORT FOR AGENCIES AND MUNICIPALITIES Includes free physical exams for municipal workers and financial support for municipalities, disease prevention programs, services and exams at local schools. INTERPRETING SERVICE AND PATIENT REPRESENTATIVE Includes hospital-based language interpreting services, purchased foreign language and sign language interpreting services provided free of charge, and costs associated with patient satisfaction surveys.	3,240,568
PATIENT CARE COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES Includes free flu shots, free medications for people unable to pay, and the difference between payments for mental health services from Lehigh County and the cost of providing services at two residential aftercare programs.	1,747,284
SPONSORSHIPS FOR COMMUNITY SERVICE ORGANIZATIONS Includes support for numerous not-for-profit organizations that are aligned with our health network's mission, along with support of the Burn Prevention Network.	542,612
*About volunteers and Act 55: As per Act 55, it is appropriate for charitable organizations to report volunteer service. This shows how valuable volunteers are to the institution and the community. Act 55 provides a formula for calculating this based on the Pennsylvania Workers Compensation Act. We follow that formula.
